

SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS TO ECONOMETRICA

1. The Econometric Society is happy to offer its members the option of submitting to *Econometrica* either electronically or by mail. Electronic submissions must be sent in PDF format via the Society's website: <http://www.econometricsociety.org/submission.html>. To submit by mail, please send a cover letter and five stapled copies of the manuscript to:

Papers must be written in either French or English. Authors submitting on paper may include a PDF version of the paper on a diskette if they wish.

2. There is no charge for submission to *Econometrica*, but only members of the Econometric Society may submit papers for consideration. In the case of coauthored manuscripts, at least one author must be a member of the Econometric Society. Nonmembers wishing to submit a paper may join the Society immediately via Blackwell Publishing's website. Note that *Econometrica* rejects a substantial number of submissions without consulting outside referees.

3. It is a condition of publication in *Econometrica* that copyright of any published article be transferred to the Econometric Society. Submission of a paper will be taken to imply that the author agrees that copyright of the material will be transferred to the Econometric Society if and when the article is accepted for publication, and that the contents of the paper represent original and unpublished work that has not been submitted for publication elsewhere. If the author has submitted the paper elsewhere, the author must indicate the journal in which *Econometrica* will be published, and the date of publication. 4. Papers may be submitted to *Econometrica* with details. There is no charge for submission to *Econometrica*, but only members of the Econometric Society may submit papers for consideration. In the case of coauthored manuscripts, at least one author must be a member of the Econometric Society. Nonmembers wishing to submit a paper may join the Society immediately via Blackwell Publishing's website. Note that *Econometrica* rejects a substantial number of submissions without consulting outside referees.

5. Submitted manuscripts should have margins of at least one inch on all sides, and footnotes, references, and appendices should be clearly organized.

6. Additional information for authors is provided in the "Manual for Authors, Revised" written by Drew Fudenberg and Dorothy Hodges. This document explains editorial policies and describes how footnotes should be formatted and clearly organized.

7. Papers should be submitted on the same sheet as the cover letter, and a list of authors and their addresses should be included.

8. If you plan to submit a paper to *Econometrica*, please send a cover letter to the Editor, Glenn Ellison. Comments on your manuscript will be sent to you by email. If you do not receive a response, please contact the Editor. Authors who submit manuscripts to *Econometrica* should also submit a copy to the Editor, Glenn Ellison.

9. Manuscripts on "Economic Theory" should be submitted to the Editor, Glenn Ellison.

10. Econometric Society announcements, including announcements of academic conferences, workshops, etc., conducted by other societies or organizations, the availability of fellowships, postdoctorates, etc., and honorary awards for publication in the News Notes section of the journal should be sent to the Editor, Glenn Ellison (address above). Deadlines for all such announcements are the fifteenth day of the fourth month prior to publication, i.e., September 15 for the January issue, November 15 for the March issue, etc. Please refer to the "Manual for Econometrica Authors, Revised" by Drew Fudenberg and Dorothy Hodges, published in the July, 1997 issue for further information on format and content.
